

The Mid-Winter Ceilidh began in about 1990 as a winter fundraiser and volunteer warm-up for the Regina Folk Festival. The Regina Folk Festival had pipers involved early on, and it wasn't long before the newly formed City of Regina Pipe Band was playing. Then, the Regina Folk Festival decided to drop the event, and the pipe band took over and has been running it ever since.

Over the years, we've had some brilliant musical perfomances, and it has been a showcase for the City of Regina Pipe Band in the community. When able, we've always tried to include as much of the wider Celtic community as we could, and you'll see that tradition continues. This has been reflected in the "festival" part of the event. When you visit the Festival during the day, you see and hear diverse and excellent performers from Regina, and have the chance to learn about groups in the community, other events, volunteer opportunities, and we'll even have a few vendors selling Celtic wares.

All proceeds from the Festival go to supporting the City of Regina Pipe Band and the Conservatory Pipe Band, our youth band. As part of our partnership with the Conservatory at the University of Regina, the CRPB supplies all instruments and uniforms for the youth band. It's a costly undertaking.



Mid-Winter Ceilidh Performances

The doors open at 7:30pm for an amazing evening of music and dance, managed by Master of Ceremonies **Andrew Gallagher**.

- **8:00 pm The City of Regina Pipe Band -** Saskatchewan Champions continuously since 1993, band strives to maintain a Grade 2 competitive standard, while at the same time providing a training ground for young players, and a springboard for musicians who want to go on the highest level bands.
- **8:30 pm Highland Dance with Courtney Horejda -** Courtney has represented Saskatchewan at the Canadian Championships and she will be performing a National dance called "Blue Bonnets" to the pipe music "The Blue Bonnets are Over the Border," a Scottish ballad about Bonnie Prince Charlie's march into England in 1745. A blue bonnet was a traditional piece of Highland dress and the large highland composition of the Jacobite Army became associated with them.
- **8:45 pm Irish Dance solo with Jenna Healy** Jenna is an award-winning Irish dancer and snare drummer with the City of Regina Pipe Band!
- **9:00 pm Emily Dubois** Emily Dubois is a musically ambitious fiddler from Langbank, Saskatchewan who has returned to the flatlands after ten years away developing her art. Now she shares it through teaching and performance and we are delighted to have her playing at the Ceilidh!
- **9:45 pm West of Mabou Trio -** With a nod to their East Coast heritage, West of Mabou carries on the tradition of Celtic musicianship with an animated and boisterous flair. The band's beginnings are simple enough a few folks on prairies getting together to play a few "chunes" on a chilly winter evening. What they found was an alchemy that led them to audiences across North America. West of Mabou Trio is Alex Rasmussen (pipes, whistles), Justin Easton (guitar) and Roberta Wallace (fiddle).



This youth group of advanced musicians is preserving the Canadian Fiddle Culture by putting a contemporary twist on both old and new fiddle tunes by stringing them together using complex arrangements - and is one of the few youth fiddle performance groups in Saskatchewan!
